



Halloween in 2020 is going to look a little different, but with a little old fashioned ingenuity and some fun surprises, Fleetwood will get its “BOO” on in style! Halloween in Fleetwood will take place on Friday 10/30 and 10/31 from 5 to 9 PM. If you don’t want to participate in having candy available for trick or treaters, just turn off your porch light.

Trick or Treating

The CDC has recommended that we do not have traditional door to door trick or treating this year. Instead, we are asking Fleetwood residents who wish to participate to place a table in their driveway or on the front lawn that is decorated and has individually wrapped/ bagged candy placed on it without a bowl. That will limit face to face contact and many hands reaching into candy bowls during the evening. If you are preparing goodie bags, the CDC recommends that you [wash your hands](#) with soap and water for at least 20 second before and after preparing the bags.

We encourage Fleetwood residents who are participating to sit on their porches and be part of the festivities by greeting the trick or treaters (at a safe distance, of course!) who come to their treat table and wish them a fun and safe evening. Why not dress up in costume yourself and join in the fun?

It is recommended that everyone continue to maintain social distancing between unrelated people at 6 feet and that face masks are used instead of Halloween masks. Why not decorate a face mask with Halloween flair?

Other ideas for low risk fun activities:

- Carving or decorating pumpkins with members of your household and displaying them
- Carving or decorating pumpkins outside, at a safe distance, with neighbors or friends
- Decorating your house, apartment, or living space
- Doing a Halloween scavenger hunt where children are given lists of Halloween-themed things to look for while they walk outdoors from house to house admiring Halloween decorations at a distance
- Having a virtual Halloween costume contest
- Having a Halloween movie night with people you live with
- Having a scavenger hunt-style trick-or-treat search with your household members in or around your home rather than going house to house
