Fleetwood Rotary Celebrates 75 Years

2026 marks the 75th year of the founding of the Rotary Club of Fleetwood. The club was formed by a group of local businessmen and community leaders in 1951. For 75 years the Fleetwood Rotary Club has been supporting local, regional, national, and international charitable efforts by donating time, money and resources. As part of Rotary International, Fleetwood Rotary is one of over 30,000 Rotary clubs active in more than 160 countries. The motto of Rotary members is “service above self”.

Locally, our club supports the Interact Club at Fleetwood high school and recognizes Fleetwood and Oley students of the month. In addition, the youth exchange program gives local high school students the opportunity to travel and study abroad and for foreign students to come to Fleetwood for the school year. Our current Rotary exchange student is Consuelo Paolucci from Italy, and we will have an inbound student from Denmark next year. We are always looking for local students who are interested in traveling abroad as Rotary exchange students.

Fleetwood Rotary also supports local projects such as pollinator gardens in Maiden creek, Fleetwood, and Richmond. In addition, the club has installed benches in the Fleetwood Park as well as other park improvements including the walking trail and tree planting at Maiden creek Park.

Fleetwood Rotary helps with the World War II weekend, Fleetwood Community Carnival, and hosts an annual car show in the park which has had more than 400 cars on exhibit. This year’s car show is June 20 which is also the 20th year of the show. Other local supported causes include “Girls on the Run”, The Dolly Parton project (which provides books to young children in the Fleetwood, Kutztown and Brandywine school districts), Hope Rescue Mission, and the LightHouse Shelter for women and children. Internationally, Fleetwood Rotary supports and participates in global grants and projects that include the eradication of Polio and improving water availability and health in other countries.

The Fleetwood Rotary club meets on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday mornings of each month at 7:30 AM at Moselem Golf Club and on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday evenings of each month at the Grand Central Tap Room and Restaurant. Recently, the Rotary formed an Impact Club for individuals that cannot make regular meetings but would like to help with local initiatives and projects. New Pool Building Opens This Summer!

In 2024, Fleetwood Borough Council approved construction of a new restroom and shower facility for the Fleetwood pool. Construction began in November 2025 and is expected to be completed in May 2026.

Funding for the new building was provided through a 50% matching grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR), along with Fleetwood Borough capital funds. The project includes a new block building with updated ADA accessible women’s and men’s restrooms, as well as a family restroom. As part of the design, rainwater from the roof will be directed into a simple rain garden located at one end of the building. In addition to the grant-funded work, several other improvements were completed as part of the overall project. These include a new perimeter fence, which was moved back to provide more lawn space for pool patrons, a new diving board, and renovation of the old restroom area. The former restroom space was gutted and will now serve as storage, with the potential to be expanded into office space in 2027. The building was designed by Laucks Architects, PC with BIA Engineering serving as project lead and handling the grounds design. DESCCO Construction was awarded the project through the competitive bidding process.

E-bikes and Similar Vehicles

The increased use of e-bikes, electric scooters, and other personal motorized vehicles has created concerns for local government, law enforcement, and residents. Their use has led to safety issues, traffic conflicts, and challenges surrounding enforcement of state laws and local ordinances. Regulations are often unclear, many riders are underage, and there is often difficulty distinguishing between legal e-bikes and those that come with additional rules surrounding their use. Riders often operate these vehicles at unsafe speeds while ignoring traffic laws and traffic control devices like stop signs and traffic lights. The police department is tasked with the need to protect public safety while also ensuring that those who are legally allowed to operate such vehicles maintain that right while doing so in a manner and location that is legal and appropriate.

Consult the included graphic to learn more about the laws and guidelines of bikes, scooters, etc. We request residents follow all rules, safety regulations, and operational guidelines. We ask parents/guardians to make sure juveniles only have access to, and operate, legal transportation based upon their age, vehicle type, etc. Also follow additional rules such as required helmets or proper lighting.

The police department does have the authority to issue citations for non-compliance with local and/or state ordinances/ laws.

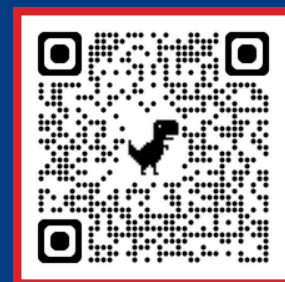

Community Supports Walnuttown Fire Company



Thoughts, prayers, and assistance were in abundance as the community came together to support the Walnuttown Volunteer Fire Company after the tragic deaths of Chief Jeff Buck and Assistant Chief Robert Shick. Bridge Replacement - Eagle Road

During the March Board of Supervisors meeting, Alan Piper from the Berks County Planning Commission discussed plans to replace the Moselem Springs bridge on Eagle Road. Draft drawings of the project and intended road closures can be found on the Richmond Township website. The bridge will be closed during construction.



The bridge will be the same length, just wider, allowing for 2 lanes of travel. Benesch engineers hope to bid the project in the fall/winter and have construction start in the spring. Construction should take about 8 months and they are hoping to finish before the RT 222 construction starts.

Richmond - Rich in History

When Berks County was formed, Richmond became one of its first townships, named for a place in England by Quakers who were attracted by William Penn's promise of opportunity. Other early settlers came from Germany, France and Switzerland. Richmond became known for some of the finest farms in the county and it contained utilitarian mills. But iron ore figured most prominently in the township's development. The Moselem, Rothermel and Heffner mines were among the most productive of the 18th century.

Fleetwood Police News

Welcome to spring! The mile high mountain of dirty snow in the Fleetwood Park has completely melted, which means it is the (un)official start of the new season! As we celebrate the arrival of warmer weather, we wish to remind you of some things to keep in mind in order to stay safe.

Seasonal Weather Related Incidents- Potholes in Pennsylvania are as common as scrapple on breakfast plates. Heavy spring rain, varying temperatures, and melting snow create hazardous driving conditions leading to disabled vehicles and motor vehicle accidents.

Warmer temperatures lead to an increase in animals (e.g., raccoons, fox, deer, birds, etc) crossing paths with humans. This can lead to property damage or safety concerns. Nocturnal animals out during the day (skunk, raccoon, fox, etc.) does not necessarily mean the animal has rabies! This time of year, mothers head out to search for food for their young at all times of the day. Also, Rabies and Distemper have symptoms that mirror each other. If you come across an animal in need, never pick it up. Do your best to contain it in a box without handling it. If you absolutely must touch it, be sure to wear thick gloves and use a blanket or thick towel to gently scoop or push the animal into a box. This is important to prevent the unnecessary death of the animal for testing and endangering your own health. There are several local wildlife rehabilitation facilities that can assist in providing expert advice. Please utilize these resources, as police officers are not trained in animal/wildlife matters. The following is a list of local resources:

- Red Creek Wildlife Center
- Pocono Wildlife Rehabilitation and Education Center
- Cricket Wildlife Center.

Property and Theft Crimes- This time of year, residents look to clean out, the housing market picks up speed, and home renovations are more likely. An increase in vehicle activity can also lead to more auto thefts and thefts from vehicles. We remind residents to always lock their homes/vehicles, including all doors and windows. Secure items of value in areas that are out of sight. Criminals are often looking for access that is quick and easy. Do not assume, "Nothing ever happens where I live" Crime can, and does, happen everywhere! Be cautious, be mindful, and don't let your guard down.
